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Sorted by the gap between access and experience.

Index 66.2, above the regional mean, with the highest access (64.9) and the highest experience (67.6) in the sample and the widest spread between domains (56 points). Tunisia leads on nine of the eleven domains, with an access score of 100.0 on safety, and is last on education (32.0) and service provision (34.0): the domains of direct public provision are the weakest by a wide margin.

Where access most exceeds experience

- Housing +26.2
- Work, income and finance +26.0
- Safety and policing +23.6

Experience furthest ahead of access

- Leisure and community participation -46.8
- Digital access and use -35.5
- Service provision and assistance -15.0
