Index 50.6, below the regional mean, with the largest access–experience gap in the sample (access 59.0, experience 42.2). High recorded contact, self-rated health and receipt of assistance (66.8 on services) sit beside low experience of care (32.7), support (37.1) and assistance (36.8). Digital access and safety are low on both measures.

Where access most exceeds experience

- Family and social relationships +48.4
- Health and care +46.1
- Service provision and assistance +30.0

Experience furthest ahead of access

- Digital access and use –7.9
- Environmental conditions –5.8
- Work, income and finance +3.8
